The following Annual Report of Council was read:—

During the Session 1913-14 four meetings have been held (by kind permission) in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, W., at which nineteen papers were read. Two numbers of the Journal, viz. No. 78 published in December and No. 79 in July, have been issued. These contain thirteen papers, together with notes and reviews, and a new list of members. Half the cost of the three plates illustrating his paper on the minerals found in the Virtuous Lady mine was defrayed by Mr. Arthur Russell.

The balance-sheet of the year ending December 31, 1913, shows that the financial position of the Society continues to be satisfactory. The assets (exclusive of the Library and stock of the Journal) amounted to £889 0s. 2d., and the liabilities to £13 9s. 1d. The value of the stock invested in the names of the Trustees of the Society was on that date £765 10s. 0d., corresponding to £14 3s. 6d. for each Life-Member. During the Session a donation of £5 was voted towards the expenses of publication of the International Tables of Constants.

During the Session 1918-14 the Society has lost by death one Honorary Member, Prof. H. Rosenbusch, and one Ordinary Member. Seven Ordinary Members have been elected. The total number of members on November 9, 1914, was 148, of whom seventeen are Honorary. Of the Ordinary Members fifty-four have compounded for their annual subscription.

The Council has to congratulate the Society on its continued prosperity.

On the motion of Mr. Butler, seconded by Prof. Bowman, the Report was adopted.

A vote of thanks to the Council of the Geological Society for permission to meet in the Apartments of the Society was carried.
