

The Commission's success may be measured by the falling number of new names published without their approval: in 1970, 15 new names were so published, only 1 of which was subsequently accepted by the Commission; in 1977, of 6 new

names published without prior approval, 1, an artificial product now found naturally, was accepted, 2 rejected, and an inconclusive vote was recorded on 3. The names rejected for the period 1969-77 are:
