### EXCERPT MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING.

Held in the Apartments of the Geological Society, November 9, 1915, at 5 p.m.

Dr. A. E. H. TUTTON, F.R.S., President, in the Chair.

Mr. William Alfred Richardson was provisionally elected an Ordinary Member of the Society. The death of Mr. T. J. Gibb was announced.

The approval of the Council was given to the Trustees for conversion of the Society's holding of 2½ % Consols into 4½ % War Loan.

The following were selected as the dates of the meetings in 1916: Tuesdays, January 18, March 21, June 20, and November 7 (Anniversary Meeting).

The draft Annual Report of Council, submitted by the Secretary, was read and approved.

A vote of thanks was passed to Dr. G. F. Herbert Smith for sending notices of the meetings of the Society to 'Nature', and other periodicals.

### ANNIVERSARY MEETING.

Held in the Apartments of the Geological Society, November 9, 1915, at 5.80 p.m.

Dr. A. E. H. TUTTON, M.A., F.R.S., President, in the Chair.

Twenty-one Members and two Visitors were present.

The election of Mr. W. A. Richardson as an Ordinary Member of the Society was confirmed.

The President nominated Messrs. Barker and Hilton to act as scrutineers of the voting-papers for the election of Officers and Council. The scrutineers reported that forty-one voting-papers had been returned to the Secretary, and that the list as nominated by the Council was approved, namely:

# The following Annual Report of Council was read:—

During the Session 1914-15 four meetings have been held (by kind permission) in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, W., at which twenty-one papers were read. Two numbers of the Journal have been issued, viz. No. 80 published in December 1914 and No. 81 in September 1915. These contain seventeen papers, two of which by Prof. G. Cesaro, of Liége, now an exile in England, are in the original French,

The balance-sheet of the year ending December 81, 1914, shows that the financial position of the Society continues to be satisfactory. The assets (exclusive of the Library and stock of the Journal) amounted to £891 7s. 10d., and the liabilities to £18 2s. 2d. The value of the Stock invested in the names of the Trustees of the Society was on that date £756 18s. 2d., corresponding to £14 5s. 6d. for each Life-Member. During the Session a further donation of £5 was voted towards the expenses of publication of the International Annual Tables of Constants.

During the Session 1914-15 the Society has lost by death one Honorary Member, Prof. G. Strüver, two past-Presidents, Sir Arthur Church and Dr. Hugo Müller, and four Ordinary Members. One Ordinary Member has resigned. Two Ordinary Members have been elected. The total number of members on November 8, 1915, was 141, of whom sixteen are Honorary. Of the Ordinary Members fifty-three have compounded for their annual subscription.

The Council has to congratulate the Society on its continued scientific activity and prosperity during the war.

On the motion of Mr. Mennell, seconded by Mr. Collingridge, the Report was adopted.

A vote of thanks to the Council of the Geological Society for permission to meet in the Apartments of the Society was carried.

The dates of meeting for 1916, proposed by the Council, were approved.
